Well Mother Nature wasn't kind to the SNOB when she had our January meeting canceled literally hours before it was to begin but we managed to conduct most of our business through social media and email.

Our February meeting, the first of 2014 was most definitely a time to catch up with events passed and plan for some important events around the corner.

One passed event was the inaugural Cleveland Winter Beer Fest, yes, another Cleveland beer event! The CWB is put on by Festivals Unlimited who also produce the Cincy Winter Beerfest, Columbus Winter Beerfest, Cincy Beerfest On Fountain Square, Columbus Summer Beerfest, Pittsburgh Summer Beerfest, Pittsburgh Winter Beerfest, and the Fireworks Party On The Bridge in Cincinnati. Friday saw attendance od about 3000 and Saturday 4000. The SNOB had around 40+ volunteers sign up to help out. I had 25 breweries in my section and cannot say enough good things about my volunteers, none walked away, passed out or got kicked out and most said they had a great albeit very busy shift. I did however have to empty a dump bucket that some unfortunate soul felt the need to puke in and I hear Tim's shirt caught some of it. CWB will be back in 2015 with the hope of making the CWB bigger, better and more

educational. They are asking SNOB about putting on brew demo's during the festival or for other ideas on educating the public about craft beer. If brewing with your electric system during the fest sounds appealing to you, give it some thought.

In February, we took a jog from beer brewing to another fermentable, hard cider, or cider as Richard Read would say. We had about 10 SNOB made ciders on hand to sample that were made after a group of us got together last fall and pressed cider from 1600 pounds of apples. Our guest speaker was Richard Read of Griffin Cider Works. Cider Master Richard talked to us about his Westlake cider making business where he make English style ciders and brought along several of his ciders to sample. Richard brought along some "light ciders", read that competitors, and two of his own English style ciders. This gave all of us a great comparison to see what "real" ciders are and how they differ.

We have some important dates coming up for events you may want to take part in or attend.

- The SNOBs BJCP Study Group starts on February 5 at 7PM and every Wednesday after that for 10 weeks. This is to prepare for the August BJCP written exam. It will be held at Market Garden Brewery and is open to SNOBs, other local home brew clubs and employees of local breweries and pubs, thanks to Paul Shick for his time commitment and Andy Tveekrem for being so accommodating at MGB. Although this starts Feb 5, you can get details and still<u>sign up here</u>.
- OCBA Winter Warmer is March 1, this is always a nice beer event with great music and a real nice outdoor cask ale section. The SNOB have 30 people signed up to volunteer.
- The annual Beer No Sweat bus trip is this April 12-13, yep, two days! We will leave early Saturday morning, stay at an Indy hotel Saturday night then work our way back home, hitting at least 9 breweries, taprooms and beer stores along the way.



The cost is \$130 per person for the bus and hotel and after the meeting it appears to be 36 going and is close to selling out, if you wish to sign up, let me know at <u>president@beersnobs.org</u> and I will add you to the list. *If you have signed up for the bus trip and have to change your mind, please let me know ASAP so we can keep the bus filled.*

• The AHA National Homebrew Competition in is Grand Rapids, MI this year and this "could" be your last chance in a while to attend one without the aid of an airplane. The dates are June 12-14 although some make it a week long event. We have 30 SNOB who are planning on making the trip, should be a great time!

Keep some these events in mind when planning your vacation days. You can sign up at meetings or give me a heads up and I can add you to the lists.
