Even if you brew outside, standing around a kettle with a healthy rolling boil is a great way to stay warm while enjoying the hobby. Wort that seems to take hours to chill in the summer can now be brought down to pitch temperature in minutes. It is my favorite time of the year to brew.

Our Monthly Night Out is coming up on the 28th for the Annual Chili Cook-off at Buckeye Brewing's Tap Stack (6:30pm, 9985 Walford Ave, Cleveland).

For our February Night Out, Andy Tveekrem has invited us SNOBs and local profession brewers to attend a soft opening of Market Garden's new "Palace of Fermentation". This will be on 2/9 @6:30...details to follow.

Also in early February, I hope to see many of you at New Belgium's Lost in the Woods Party on 2/6. Sour beers to be poured at this event include La Folie (wood-aged sour brown ale), Transatlantique Kriek (wood-aged sour cherry ale), and Love Blackberry Felix (sour ale aged in blackberry flavored whiskey barrels).

The National Homebrew Competition application window opens on 2/1 and runs until 2/7. During our Feb 1st meeting Mike Ontolchik will provide additional information on the competition, as well as the National Homebrewers Conference coming up on 6/9 - 6/11 in Baltimore.

For those of you lucky enough to have registered entries in the Wizard of Saaz homebrew competition before the cap was reached, the entry window will open on 2/20 and run through 3/4. Competition organizer Larry Reuter and Elmer "Goose" Steingass will be at our Feb 1st meeting to answer any outstanding questions. Larry will also be talking to us about forming



an exploratory committee for determining if we should attempt to bring the National Homebrewers Conference to Cleveland in a few years.

Our February technical presentation will be given by Jeff Bradbury of Lucky Owl Brewing of Chagrin Falls, OH. Jeff will be discussing the challenges of starting a commercial brewery from scratch. If you have dreams of translating your homebrewing skills into your own commercial brewery, you will not want to miss Jeff's talk.
