Last week Garin Wright from Buckeye Brewing Company invited as back to the Tapstack for our 3rd annual SNOB Chili Cook-Off. A total of 9 pots of chili were entered and judged by fellow club members. I can honestly say that there wasn't a bad chili in the house. Thanks to everyone for bringing their A-game to what has proven to be one of our most popular Nights Out. This year there was a tie for second place between Scott Masony (a previous champion) and Jim Kasper. With so much great chili, 2nd place was quite an achievement. The 1st place chili was brewed cooked by our 2017 SNOB Chili Champion Jaime Polter. Thank you so much Scott, Jim, and Jaime for sharing your wonderful creations with us. We look forward to tasting your 2018 entries!

The first upcoming event I'd like to promote is our February 6th monthly meeting. Rachel Reitz has been spending many hours and great effort in putting together a special meeting for us. Instead of our usual erudite presentation on a technical aspect of brewing, we've decided to mix things up a little bit this month. Rachel will be hosting a brewing version of Jeopardy. We will be broken up into teams which will be asked to come up with questions to the answers that Rachel has organized on the board. The prizes will be raffle tickets for the winners that can be used at our monthly meeting raffle table. This month's raffle table will be beefed-up for this event. Make sure you study up on your beer knowledge, or at least sit next to someone smart!

Jim has planned another great night out for us for the month of February. We will converge on the brand-new Masthead Brewing Company on Tuesday the 21st at 6:30 pm. Located in the historic Bryant Building at 1261 Superior Avenue, Masthead has only been open for a few weeks but already has an impressive variety of Stouts, an IPA, Wit, and a Blond Ale. I have

not yet been to Masthead, but I've heard nothing but wonderful things and am looking forward to raising a few of their pints with my fellow SNOBs.

For those of you who appreciate a more typical meeting, fear not! We will be returning to a technical presentation format for the March 6th meeting. One of my personal brewing weaknesses is traditional recipe formulation. When Mike Ontolchik approached me a few months ago about giving a presentation on this topic I jumped at the idea. By now we probably all have a pale ale or stout recipe worked out, but where do we start when we want to brew something new? Mike will be showing us the keys to develop our own true-to-style recipes. With traditional styles sometimes less can be more as long as you pay careful attention to the nuances of ingredient selection. Anyone who has struggled with recipe formulation or has not yet brewed using their own recipes will not want to miss this presentation.

John Majetic has once again outdone himself planning this year's SNOB Beer No Sweat Bus Trip. On April 1st-2nd we will be departing from Barons Bus Lines (12800 Brookpark Rd, Cleveland) and slowly meandering our way across the beerscape of northern Ohio and southern Michigan. In the course of 2 days we will be visiting 11 breweries as well as an iconic Michigan craft beer bar, HopCat. This is not your grandfather's bus either. Ours will be outfitted with large comfy seats, a bathroom, WiFi, and most importantly; beer and SNOB members. We've got over 30 people signed up so far, but are still looking to fill more seats. The cost is \$95 per person (payable to our treasurer, Ace) for the bus fare. John has negotiated block pricing at the Holiday Inn Express in Okemos, MI (near the Michigan State campus) for \$149/night, which you should be able to split with another SNOB. This is a much better price than I could find on my own for this area. You and your roomie are responsible for booking your own room, which you should do ASAP if you plan on going. Be sure to tell them you are looking for the SNOB group rate when you call to reserve your room ((517) 349-8700). You can cancel the room up to 24 hours prior to check-in free of charge, so don't hesitate to book now. If you are a lone wolf and are looking for a roommate, contact our secretary Mark and he will let you know of other members looking to split a room. For <\$200 you're really getting a good deal with this trip. You'll get to socialize with great people, discuss beer & brewing, and visit some new breweries...safely and comfortably.

It is one of my goals this year as president to update our bylaws to make sure we are keeping up to date with standard AHA-affiliated club practices and with the changing times in the homebrewing community. Our current bylaws are only a few short pages long and were drafted many years ago when times were simpler and our club membership was smaller. One subject I will be reviewing and would like to emphasize is the appropriate behavior that is expected by members at club functions. It is a privilege to be a SNOB. Unacceptable behavior can result in members being asked to leave the club. There was an incident at a recent club event that involved a person touching a SNOB member in an unwanted sexual manner. This will be taken seriously and will not be tolerated. No amount of inebriation excuses this type of behavior. If you are caught behaving this way, you will be banned from the club.

Now that I've sobered you all up, here is a list of upcoming homebrew competitions in our area. Throwing beers into competitions is one of my favorite parts of homebrewing. If you've been shy up until now about having your beer judged at an official competition, don't be! It's a



great opportunity to receive valuable feedback from experienced judges whether you feel you have a winning beer or even if you'd just like someone to break it down and tell you why it smells like a baby diaper. (That's probably a bacterial infection by the way!)

Beer no Sweat Bus Trip 2017, planned for April 1st-2nd, 31 so far will be heading to southern Michigan. If you've never been, you should check this out. Baron's Bus Line will be taking us



BREWERY HOPPING for two days. We will take a break in Okemos for the night on Saturday. Below is our itinerary, note that start time is 9:20AM, that's when the bus LEAVES so make sure you arrive in ample time for your security screening and body cavity checks. We will have a jockey box on board so if there are two folks that want to send along kegs to keep up hydrated between stops, please speak up here. I do have SNOB Barleywine and Saison I could bring.

Big thanks to John Majetic who has once again put in a lot of work arranging all the stops, bus and hotel.

HOW MUCH WILL THIS COST ME? Similar to last year, the cost per person for the bus is \$95 and the cost of the hotel is \$149 for double occupancy. That makes the individual cost about \$170 each. You should pay Ace \$95 for the bus at your earliest convenience.

WHO AM I SLEEPING WITH? Well that's up to you and we won't judge. Hopefully we will all end up finding a suitable roomie so that there are two per room. As of now, there are 3-4 whom we need to get paired up.

WHO PAYS FOR THE ROOMS? You as a pair of roomies will reserve and pay for your own rooms. Call the Holiday inn Express Okemos at 517-349-8700 and reserve ASAP as rooms are VERY hard to come by, be sure to ask for the SNOB discount. DO NOT PROCRASTINATE in making reservations. IF extra rooms get reserved, they can be canceled 24 hours in advance or as soon as we are all paired up. Due to the numbers, I have increased our block of rooms from 15 to 20.

WHAT SHOULD I BRING ALONG? Bottles of fermentables to share, munchies, a cooler if you will be bringing home a stash, your fav glass for bus beer, munchies, one change of sox and underware, munchies, spending cash, cell phone charger and munchies.

I will bring a jockey box and seat protectors and tank of co2.
