What an incredible month it's been! SNOBs are winning competition medals everywhere. SNOBs once again served the best homebrew at the National Homebrewers Conference (HomebrewCon). The campfire roared as large as ever at the annual SNOB "Brew & Canoe" campout. Someone told me a few local sports teams & figures have won national championships recently too. In the 11 years since I've moved to Northeast Ohio I have never seen this much joy, celebration, and optimism in the air.

Firstly, I'd like to once again thank Jennifer Hermann for sharing her kombucha knowledge and SCOBY children with us during the June Meeting. I have yet to pitch her child into a tea to build up my own SCOBY, but I will be within the next few weeks. I'm still waiting for my mail-ordered fermentation jar, warmer, and temp controller to arrive.

For those of you who were too foolish or too broke to attend HomebrewCon in Baltimore the month, shame on you! You missed enlightening seminars, fresh seafood, bargains & free stuff on the vendor floor, and an opportunity to mingle with like-minded homebrewers from all over the country. I saved \$100 on an Exact iDip photometer water testing kit, and brought back lots of goodies for the July SNOB raffle. During the conference it was announced that HomebrewCon2017 will be in Minneapolis next summer. If you weren't able to make it to Baltimore, I strongly recommend attending next year.

Congratulations to Steve Rapko and Tom Tucker. Two of their beers medaled in the final round of the National Homebrew Competition, which was judged and announced at HomebrewCon. Steve won a bronze medal for his American pale ale and Tom won a bronze medal for his English pale ale. The NHC is the largest international beer competition in the world, eclipsing commercial competitions like the Great American Beer Festival, World Beer Cup, and even Son of Brewzilla (I know, crazy, right?). I cannot understate how proud I am to say that I am part of a club that had 2 medal winners in this competition.



Speaking of Steve Rapko, has everyone seen the results of the King of the Mountain Homebrew competition from June 18th? Steve won 1<sup>st</sup> AND 2<sup>nd</sup> place overall Best of Show for his Session IPA and his Pale Ale. In addition to Steve's huge day, I'd also like to give a shout-out to Pete Campen (SNOB librarian!) whose Cream Ale won honorable mention in the Best of Show (4<sup>th</sup> place overall) and Tim McDonnell and Mark Rames for winning Best of Show for their ABC in the Mead category. Many other SNOBs won medals as well. It was great day at the Willoughby Brewing Company (host of the competition) for SNOBs. I look forward to trying Steve's beer, which will be scaled up and brewed on Willoughby's commercial system.

2 weeks ago a couple dozen SNOBs spent a few nights on the Huron River drinking homebrew and feeding mosquitos. The annual SNOB Brew and Canoe went off without a hitch. Special thanks to Tim Mcdonnell for providing the venue and John Majetic for smoking the brisket for our feast on Saturday night. This year our campout also coincided with Small City Taphouse 2 years Anniversary party in neighboring Sandusky. SNOBs were of course well represented at this party. If you haven't made the trek out to Small City yet, you are missing out on one of the best craft beer restaurants in Ohio. Their sushi and Vietnamese cuisine is Pho King good.

Our next meeting will be held at Sachsensheim Hall on July 11th. The crux of the meeting will be Mike Ontolchik's technical presentation on sour beer off-flavors. Sour beers are one of the most sought after styles for beer nerds, but most (including myself) have a lot to learn about what a great sour beer is supposed to taste like. Mike will be going into detail all of the ugly bugs and flavors that sour brewers try to avoid. If you have or are planning on homebrewing a sour beer, this presentation will provide invaluable information on how to prevent these unwanted flavors in your brews.

#### Excerpt from the August 1991 Newsletter

"Beer yeast, when dispersed in water, breaks down into an infinite number of small spheres. If these spheres are transferred to an aqueous solution of sugar they develop into small animals. They are endowed with a sort of suction trunk with which they gulp up the sugar from the solution. Digestion is immediately and clearly recognizable because of the discharge of excrements. These animals evacuate ethyl alcohol from their bowels and carbon dioxide from their urinary organs. **Big Brew** beers were moved around on Saturday by a group of 6-8 SNOBs. 50 gallons of Brett Barleywine was vacuumed from the oak barrel into 5 10-gallon cornies furnished by Chris Smith. These are now sitting in Tim's walk-in cooler to settle and at some point will need to be transferred to some of our 5-gallon cornies for aging, care, dry-hopping and bringing to SNOB events. 50 gallons of the Saison we brewed this year was then put into the oak barrel with the remainder going into cornies. Hopefully you all are ready to drink a lot of Barleywine and Saison.
