There are several events and competitions coming up in the next few months, so don't let the balmy weather scare you into hanging up your mash paddles!

If you were unable to attend our May night out/potluck dinner at Haus Malts you missed out on a great time. We are truly blessed to have Andrew & Craig in our community. They are enthusiastic supporters of homebrewers and craft beer. The beers I've made using Haus Malts have all turned out fantastic. Thanks to Jim Jadwisiak and Andrew Martahus for organizing everything.

The American Homebrewers Association's annual "HomebrewCon" conference is now about a week away and SNOB will have a significant presence in Baltimore. 13 of our beers will be judged at the National Homebrew Competition Final Round. Thanks to Greg Irving and Mark Rames for hand-delivering all of the SNOB & SAAZ entries last Thursday (5/26). Most other entries are shipped from all over the country. With the temperatures as high as they've been, we were very fortunate to have Greg & Mark drive them there in a cooler for us instead of leaving our beers to the mercy of the hot mail trucks. I'd also like to thank Tim Mcdonnell for letting us store our HomebrewCon Club Night beers in his walk-in cooler and for getting them to LD Carlson for shipment to Baltimore. Thanks also to Brian Wright & LD Carlson for once again shipping a pallet of our kegs to the conference. Club Night is going to be a blast this year!

Our June 6th meeting will not be a typical meeting. Sure, there will be great food served up by Grumpy & Mo, and plenty of homebrew on tap and shared from bottles. What will be different is the content focus. Our technical presentation will be provided by Jennifer Hermann who will be teaching us how to ferment tea into a refreshing low-alcohol beverage called Kombucha. Also joining us will be Paula Hershman, President of Storehouse Tea. Storehouse Tea is Northeast Ohio's premier hand crafter of



organic and fair trade loose leaf teas. Paula will be passing around small samples, and will have \$2 bags and \$10 boxes of her product to sell to those of us who are interested.

June 24th-26th is the weekend of our annual summer SNOB campout: Brew & Canoe. Brew & Canoe is a wonderful opportunity to socialize, share some homebrew, and enjoy the summer. The campout is located on the Huron River (hence the Canoe), so feel free to bring your boats, kayaks, fishing poles, etc. SNOB will provide the meat, but please bring a side or 2 to share. It's a SNOB event, so you know there will be lots of great homemade food and brews passed around the campfire. I usually bring a tent to sleep in, but campers are welcome and common as well.

Excerpt from the April 1991 Newsletter

A marriage between a duke from lower Saxony and a daughter of an aristocrat from the south of Germany brought bock beer to Munich. Einbeck considered bock beer to be a beer to be consumed in the beer garden in the springtime. The cool weather meant a higher alcohol beer was needed. Since bock is German for billy goat, which is a symbol for Capricorn, Munich considered bock a beer to be consumed in late December and early January. That is why some breweries still brew Christmas bocks.

Big Brew was held on May 14 at Fat Head's Brewery and Taproom. We brewed a 100-gallon batch of saison using 100% Haus Malts. It was like brewing in the winter but everyone soldiered on through the cold, sleet and rain. Fortunately Pete Campen brought an EZ-Up tent and it saved our beer from being watered down in the deluge. Thanks to all who helped.



This raises some logistical issues that we need to address before the saison fermentation is complete. At 3-4 weeks after Big Brew, we will need to move the brett barleywine from the barrel into around 10 kegs, so we need some empty kegs. I still have 5 kegs tied up in SNOB beers and cannot furnish enough. Maybe we can find 10 stewards for these beers where we can use your keg and you care for it, bring to events, maybe even dry hop or whatever. Just know your keg will be tied up for a while. Tim, Dan and myself have vacuum pumps to remove barleywine from the barrel so maybe we can run 2 pumps at a time to speed things up.

The 2016 Ohio State Fair Homebrew Competition will be held Saturday, June 4 at the Ohio Expo Center (will be using the 2015 BJCP Style Guidelines.) Entry deadline was May 17.

We are in need of BJCP sanctioned judges and would like to extend to you an invitation to judge at our BJCP sanctioned competition. If you are able to join us, please complete the attached Judge Registration Form and email it back to me (if you would rather not complete the form, just let me know if you will be able to judge one, or both, sessions.) I would appreciate receiving your response by May 1. If you want to judge you can contact Brett for the pdf or myself and I can forward his email to you.

A complimentary lunch will be provided as well as coffee and donuts in the morning. We are again offering out of town judges complimentary hotel accommodations. **Andrew has a room and will share with someone if needed, let him know.**

We again had more than 500 entries last year and would love to have you join us this year. If you have any questions regarding our competition, please call or email me. I appreciate your consideration and look forward to hearing from you.
