We enjoyed wings on Friday night, smoked meat on Saturday, and Scotch eggs for breakfast both mornings. We had a total of 35 kegs of homebrew flowing including a few of our big brew variants, commercial craft beers, and even a couple of my own brews.

We've got quite a few events coming up in the next few weeks, so recharge your livers and keep your schedules open. This Saturday (10/1) is the return of our club's annual homebrew competition, Son of Brewzilla. Mike has had a difficult time getting steward and judges to volunteer this year, so please sign up to help if you haven't already. You do not have to be an expert, competitive home brewer, or certified Cicerone to steward. This past Sunday we had a fantastic turnout for our unboxing day. It only took about an hour to unbox and check in almost 400 entries. I planned on spending most of the afternoon unboxing, but luckily there was plenty of fresh Fat Heads beer on at the taproom to keep me from getting too bored later in the day.



Our October monthly meeting (10/3) is only 2-days after Son of Brewzilla, and I expect many of us will be sharing our medal-winning beers and reveling in the fact that we thoroughly defeated SAAZ to reclaim the Cuyahoga Cup. October is our second to the last formal meeting of the year and we will be holding our annual officer nominations at that time. If you've met someone in our club that you'd think would do a nice job holding a position, please don't hesitate to throw them under the bus and nominate them. The worst thing that can happen is that they will be flattered, but will respectfully decline. Elections will be held during the November meeting. Remember, you don't have to be present to be nominated or elected. Skipping these meetings is not advisable if you do not want to be thrust into a position of SNOB responsibility next year. In addition to celebrating our Son of Brewzilla winners and nominating new officers we will be welcoming Market Garden brewmaster/reigning SNOBtoberfest croquet champion Andy Tveekrem to speak to us on the differences and challenges between commercial and home brewing.

will discuss legal issues brewing in Ohio, safeguards you should know, and how your brewery can protect its most valuable assets.


