# President's Krausening

The kids are heading back to school and the temperatures are starting to cool off. If your home brewery has been quiet this summer, now is the perfect time to start ramping up production. The drop-off window for our annual Son of Brewzilla homebrew competition will close in only 9 weeks. If you're entering a beer that requires a little aging or lagering you'd better get brewing! If you aren't entering SoB, you should still consider firing up the kettle to get your spiced fall and big ABV holiday beers ready in time to share with family and

friends a few months from now. This past weekend Mike and I brewed a barleywine using a reiterated mash technique that should be ready just in time for the cooler fall and winter months.

Our September meeting has been moved to August 28<sup>th</sup> in order to avoid conflict with the Labor Day holiday. The meeting will be loaded with upcoming event details, a very hoppy presentation by Greg Irving, and a short promotion by Shelly Kramer from MadTree Brewing Company out of Cincinnati. MadTree is distributing to Northeast Ohio starting on Monday and Shelly asked if she could come say a few words about their brewery and bring some swag for our raffle. If you haven't had MadTree yet you won't be disappointed. They make fantastic brews. I'm not just saying that because she bribed me with raffle swag!

For those of you who aspire to be nationally ranked BJCP judges, Paul Shick is offering a weekly study course starting on September 6<sup>th</sup>. A complete listing of dates and locations (most are at Market Garden) can be found further down the newsletter. Paul is administering a BJCP written exam for those interested and qualified on Sunday, November 5th. To be qualified to take this exam you must have scored a minimum of 80% on a previous BJCP tasting exam. Many people who attend Paul's study course will not be eligible to take the exam, as this is not required for the weekly study sessions. Space is limited, so reserve your spot today by emailing Paul at shick@jcu.edu.

The great annual SNOB fall campout known as SNOBtoberfest with be held once again at the Brooklyn Exchange Cabin at Hinckley Reservation. The event will run from Friday evening September 22<sup>nd</sup> through Sunday morning the 24<sup>th</sup>. Bring a tent, camper, or

sleeping bag for one of the bunks in the cabin. Your dues pay for the cabin rental and meats for the dinners, so we require all attendees to be up to date on yearly dues (it's only \$30 you cheapskates!). Guests of paid members are welcome as well. Our meal plan for Friday night will be thin crust, flash-cooked pizzas. Special thanks to Bob Wright of the Buckeye Beer Engine for letting us borrow his pizza oven and for sourcing our dough and sauce! If you plan on coming Friday night, please bring a pizza topping or two to share. Saturday night's main meat course is yet to be determined, as we'll probably wait to see what animal parts are on sale that week. It will most likely be slow cooked in a SNOB-sized BBQ trailer. If you plan on attending Saturday night please bring a side dish to share. Regardless of when you come, please bring some homebrew, commercial beer, or even a bottle of fine liquor to share if that's your fancy. If you have a jockey box, please consider bringing it. We should have several dozen taps available to plug into if you're bringing a keg regardless.

The annual Beer Women Rock event is coming up fast this year. If you identify as a woman and love to brew please consider joining fellow SNOB Jessica Ihms on September 10<sup>th</sup> at Brick and Barrel brewing company for a collaboration brew day with brewmaster Karl Spiesman. Regardless of your gender, please consider attending the unveiling of the collaboration on September 30<sup>th</sup> at Jukebox (across from Saucy Brew Works on W 29<sup>th</sup>). A portion of the sales will go to charity (details are still being ironed out) and you'll be supporting women in the industry & hobby. Brewing is not an all-boys club! Some of the best SNOB brewers & judges are women. If you're interested in joining the brew team please shoot Jessica an email at jihms@morangroup.org.

As mentioned earlier, the annual SNOB homebrew competition Son of Brewzilla will be held this year on October 28<sup>th</sup> at Fat Heads Production in Middleburg Heights. Our entry cap of 450 was reached within a few days of the registration opening this year. All registered entries must be paid by Friday, October 13<sup>th</sup>. If you were unable to register your beers before the cap was reached you may have another opportunity after we purge the unpaid entries. Keep an eye on the SoB website and in SNOB emails for a notification when/if this happens. The Cuyahoga Cup is awarded twice a year at the annual SNOB and SAAZ (our neighboring Akron club) competitions to the club who aggregates the most medals through a weighted points system. I've been SNOB president for one Son of Brewzilla and two Wizard of SAAZ's and have yet to see our club win the coveted Cuyahoga Cup. Let's bring our best effort this year! Even if you don't have beers entered, please consider volunteering to help as a judge, steward, or during our unboxing day (October 22<sup>nd</sup>). The drop-off window technically closes on 10/20, but if you help unbox you are welcome to bring your entries in on 10/22.

Cleveland Beer Week will take place this year from October 13<sup>th</sup> – 22<sup>nd</sup>. They are expanding the number of events and are actively recruiting beer-savvy volunteers. There are too many events to list here, but I recommend perusing the events calendar on their website: http://www.clevelandbeerweek.org. They will add more events as the week approaches, so be sure to check back periodically. If you are interested in volunteering please send Kim an email (kimb@clevelandbeerweek.org) and let her know! Many of the events run out of volunteer space, so don't wait if you have a particular event in mind.

Platform Brewing Company has partnered with Heinen's Grocery Store to bring back their "Bragging Rights" homebrew competition for a second year. Last year our very own Greg Irving won with his "Tropical Nor'easter" New England-style IPA. This year the only restriction is that your entry can be no greater than 7% ABV. The winner will have the opportunity to have their recipe brewed and canned on an industrial scale and sold in Heinen's stores during Cleveland Beer Week. Judging takes place on August 31st and entries



are due by August 30<sup>th</sup>. Information on how to enter can be found on the competition's Eventbrite page here:

The Cleveland Oktoberfest (from Paul Shick) is once again holding its Microbrew Competition on the Friday of Labor Day weekend, September 1st, starting at about 6:30PM at the Berea Fairgrounds. I hope that you'll be able to help us out again.

We're expecting about 80+ entries this year from roughly 20 breweries around the region, so my hope is to run about 10 panels of judges. As in years past, we'll be using "mixed" judging panels of experienced judges (BJCP and/or professionals) with local media celebrities. This makes for a more relaxed atmosphere than we get at most competitions. I'll be registering the competition with the BJCP shortly, so those of you who care about such things will get points.

I can promise you some good beer, good food and good music – all together, it should be a very fun and relaxed evening.

I have no idea if Paul still needs more volunteers but feel free to approach him if you'd like to help out.

**Beer Women Rock** is on the brew! Jessica Ihms is brewing with Karl at Brick and Barrel on September 10th for the upcoming Beer Women Rock event on September 30th.
