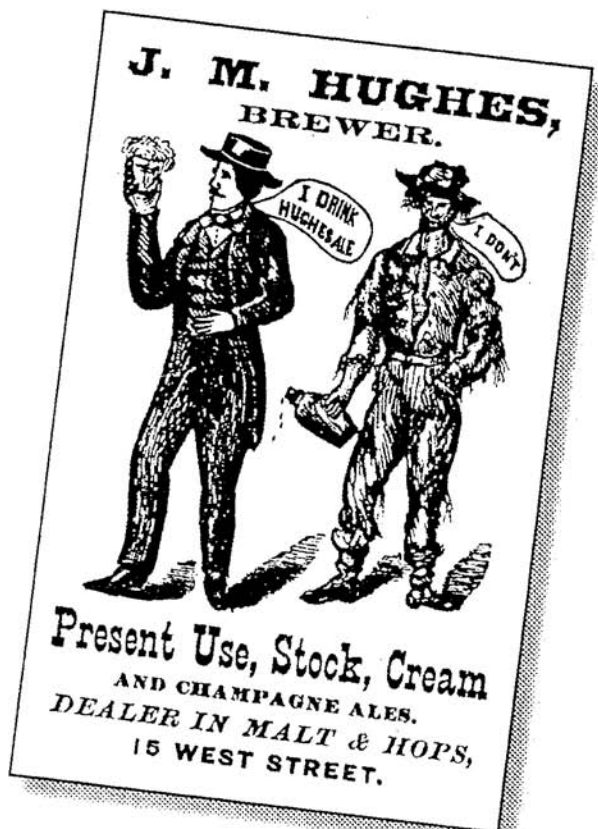

1840-1843: Hawley & Company, Cleveland Brewery

1843-1847: Herrick Childs, Cleveland Brewery

1847-1865: Samuel C. Ives' Cleveland Brewery

January 1, 1865: Brewery destroyed by fire attributed to "Confederate emissaries sent North to inflict a staggering blow upon their victors."

Samuel C. Ives was Cleveland's first beer mogul.

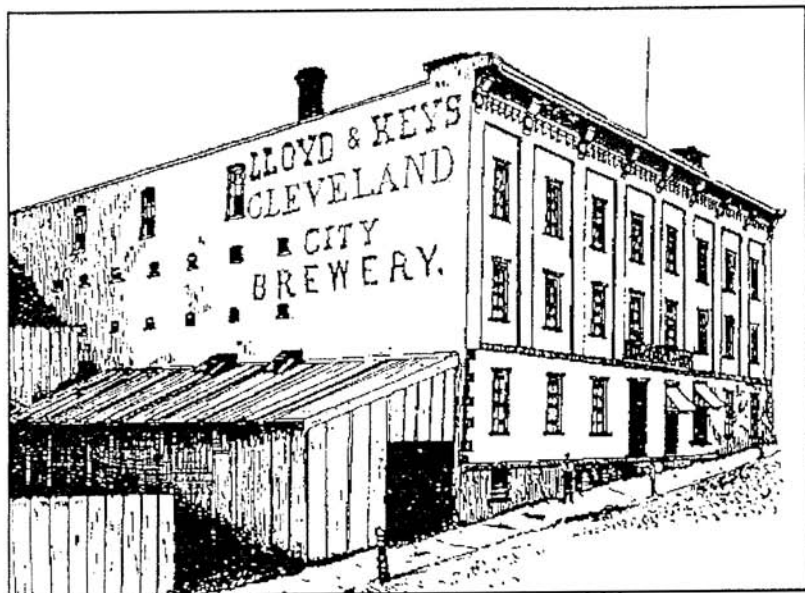

1895-1909: Daniel H. Keys' Cleveland City Brewery

1909: Brewing ceased after the death of Daniel Keys', thus ending his 60-year career as an ale-brewer in Cleveland.

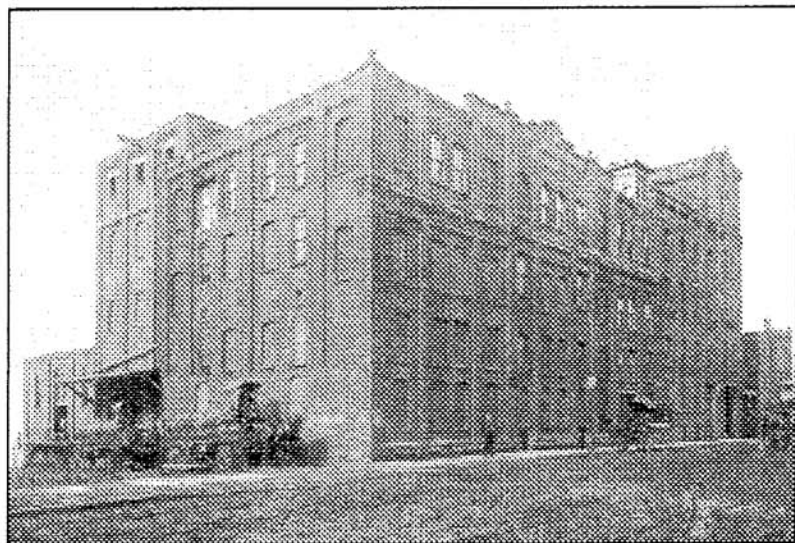

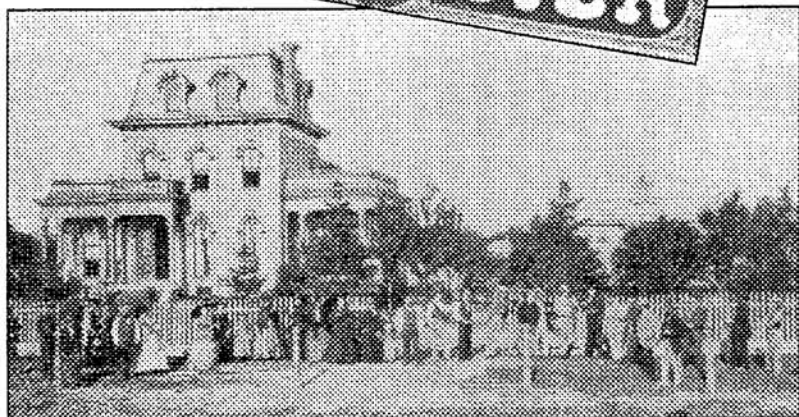


BEER GARDENS

Cleveland's most popular 19th century beer gardens –

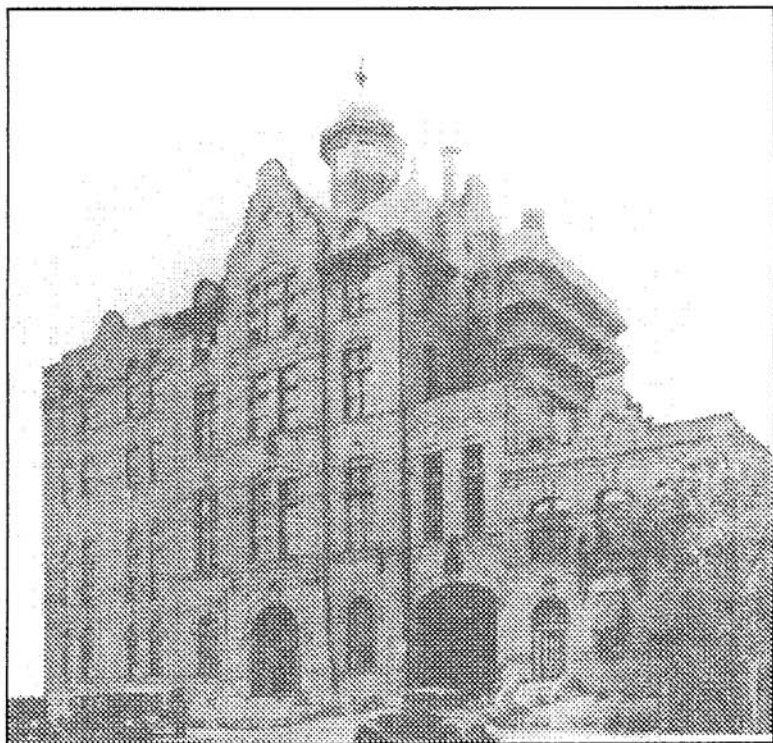
- **Paul Kindsvater's Garden**, Wilson Street & St. Clair.

1946: Beer production ceased as Brewing Corporation of America's (Carling's) main plant on Quincy Avenue was expanded.

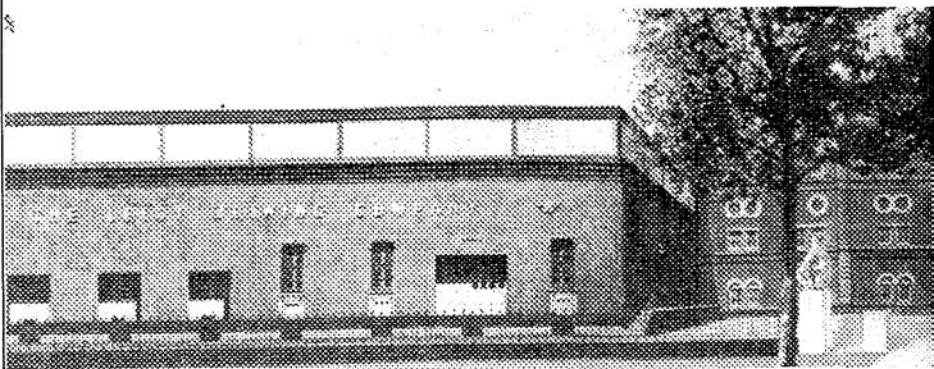

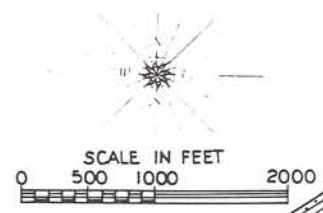
